PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome to Term 3, Tacoma!

It was a rather wet holiday and I know many of our families were again affected heavily by flooding. Our thoughts are with you and please let me know if I can support you in any way.

Just a reminder to keep your children OUT of the floodwater during times the river/lake floods. Floodwater is TOXIC and carries raw sewerage, dead animals and has an extremely high level of unsafe chemicals from pesticides and fertilisers. It is completely unsafe and dangerous for our students to be walking through or even kayaking through the flood water. There are also unsafe submerged objects below the water.



Floodwater can make you sick

- Floodwater can have sewage, chemicals and rubbish that can cause serious illness and injuries
- ➤ Never swim in floodwater
- Protect yourself when cleaning up after a flood and wear masks, boots and gloves
- Wash your hands with soap and water after contact with floodwater to prevent disease.

TEACHER PROFESSIONAL LEARNING






